



Let's work together to stop bullying

Linden Park Primary School aims to provide a warm, caring and safe environment in which children can learn, including when children play.

So ... what is bullying?

The national definition of bullying for Australian schools states:

'Bullying is an ongoing misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that causes physical and/or psychological harm'. See: https://bullyingnoway.gov.au

To stop bullying at Linden Park Primary School:

teachers will ...

- make sure the victim of bullying behaviour is safe:
- 2. adopt a restorative justice approach to bullying behaviour, which initially means asking:
- √ what happened?
- ✓ who's been harmed?
- ✓ what needs to happen to repair some of that harm?

children should ...

- 1.remember if someone is rude or mean once it is not considered bullying but: if someone says or does something to harm several times on purpose then that's bullying;
- 2. do any of the following:
- √ ignore a bully;
- ✓ tell a bully to stop and mean it;
- ✓ talk to a teacher, a parent or someone you trust.

parents and carers can ...

- 1. discuss and practise strategies to address bullying behaviour with children in your care;
- 2. recognise the warning signs of bullying behaviour, including children who suddenly do not wish to attend school;
- 3. inform the school about bullying behaviour.
